NOTICE REGARDING THE MAY 2020 REVISION PACKET

Please place this Notice in the front of your binder until publication of Revision No. 206 of the California Peace Officers Legal Sourcebook.

In the past 60 days, the California courts have published a limited number of cases impacting only a few chapters of the *Sourcebook*. When this occurs, we do not prepare a Revision Packet and, instead, provide this notice of any significant published cases.

- The only significant case to date was decided by the United States Supreme Court on April 6, 2020, in *Kansas v. Glover* (2020) 140 S.Ct. 1183. Consistent with California law, the Court held that an officer lawfully stopped a driver based solely on information that the truck he was driving was registered to someone whose driver's license had been revoked. Under the totality of the circumstances, nothing negated the reasonable inference that the registered owner was the driver and the investigative stop was valid.

Glover will be included in Revision No. 206 scheduled for publication in July 2020.
